arguably the greatest ball club in national league history the 1953 brooklyn dodgers recorded some staggering statistics they led the league in virtually every offensive category while fielding some of the finest defensive players of the era but the team's extraordinary

success on the field is only part of their story jackie robinson was in his seventh year since breaking the color barrier but ugly racist incidents were yet to abate and several marred the 53 season the most intense rivalry in sports climaxed with a september brawl as dodger carl furillo floored giants manager leo durocher first baseman gil hodges weathered a horrendous slump with the support of the team s devoted fans this book tells the exciting story of the 53 brooklyn dodgers highlighting a season and a team

a window dresser who sees the world as a creative playground a jewish grandmother s try as chaucer s saucy wife of bath the perils of online dating a struggling artist examines her life bestselling author meredith allard the loving husband trilogy when it rained at hembry castle presents her first short story collection

remembering women s activism examines the intersections between gender politics and acts of remembrance by tracing the cultural memories of women who are known for their actions memories are constantly being reinterpreted and are profoundly shaped by gender this book explores the gendered dimensions of history and memory through nation based and transnational case studies from the asia pacific region and anglophone world chapters consider how different forms of women s activism have been remembered the efforts of suffragists in britain the usa and australia to document their own histories and preserve their memory constance markievicz and qiu jin two early twentieth century political activists in ireland and china respectively the struggles of women workers and the movement for redress of those who have suffered militarized sexual abuse the book concludes by reflecting on the mobilization of memories of activism in the present transnational in scope and with reference to both state centred and organic acts of remembering including memorial practices physical sites of memory popular culture and social media remembering women s activism is an ideal volume for all students of gender and history the history of feminism and the relationship between memory and history

today gated communities abound in our nation but what was it like living in one 100 years ago author arnold rosen describes life in new york s first gated community the gate was erected in 1898 in his book sea gate remembered as the pages turn this book tours you through the generation s coming of age in the 1930 s and 40s the games we played the stores we shopped the schools we attended and the somber war years so much of the many privacies beyond the gate are revealed by the author and ex sea gaters who spent their youthful years beyond the wired fences at the southwestern tip of brooklyn walled off from coney island next door and extending to the rest of north america arnold rosen author of twenty books on computers and office technology grew up in sea gate where his father owned and operated sideshows and amusement rides beyond the fence in coney island now professor emeritus at nassau community college rosen graduated with a bs degree from ohio state university an an ms degree from hunter college after serving in the u s air force during the korean war the author lived in sea gate from 1932 to 1952 and now has come full circle to retire in another gated community sun city hilton head south carolina

the community of east harlem in new york city lays claim to a rich and culturally diverse history once home to 35 ethnicities and 27 languages the neighborhood attracted irish jewish and italian immigrants in the early 20th century and later saw an influx of puerto rican immigrants and african americans in this oral history former and current residents recount the early days the post world war ii rise of public housing the departure of eastern european inhabitants the growth of latino and african american populations the spirited 1960s the urban blight of the 1980s and the more recent resurgence and gentrification this story of strength and struggle provides a vivid portrait of a fascinating community and the many resilient people who have called it home

the recent wave of immigration into this country has given rise to myriad concerns from the worries about the impact of immigration on the nation s economy to questions about whether multilingual education should be used in public schools the resulting debates have overshadowed some very good news this influx of new immigrants has resulted in an astonishing rebirth of many of our older decaying cities nowhere has this demographic renewal been more apparent than in new york city as louis winnick demonstrates in new people in old neighborhoods a timely and perceptive study of the effects of immigration in brooklyn s sunset park sunset park was born of the late nineteenth century flood of immigrants who developed a prosperous waterfront commerce by the end of world war it the community had achieved a thriving maturity yet the decades following world war it

brought about a period of urban decay lifted only by the post 1965 influx of more than 20 000 immigrants most notably from asia and the caribbean basin these new immigrants not only revived the dying community but enriched it with greater ethnic diversity than it had ever known winnick combines data on ethnic change and living patterns with data on employment housing school enrollment and subway ridership to study the revitalization of sunset park he discusses the ethnic composition and characteristics of the new immigrants trends in self employment and entrepreneurship microcapitalism immigrant impact upon retailing manufacturing and the lower echelons of the service industries skill and education levels and presence in the professions winnick also discusses the immigrants positive effect on faltering new york systems such as the subways and public schools and places immigrant renewal within the larger context of overall housing and economic regeneration in new york city new people in old neighborhoods views today s immigrants as the historic heirs to the community builders of the last century and offers important insights into the often troubled yet transforming relationship between the nation and its foreign born population the future of these immigrants will be a yardstick to measure the quality and performance of our cities and their neighborhoods in the years ahead

eugene o neill remembered is a collection of reminiscences by o neill s contemporaries friends and family that illuminate the life of one of america s most significant playwrights

i was a fun loving grandmother who would go out of my way to create wonderful memories and adventures for my grandchildren unfortunately i suffered a very unexpected debilitating health crisis and it took me a while to get back on my feet i was thrilled when i was finally able to regain my independence and move into a new apartment i was beginning to feel like my old self again until one fateful night when the unthinkable happened i was too embarrassed to tell anyone because i was afraid that nobody would believe me i felt totally alone and i was in my own private hell i was terrified that my nightmare would never end i knew that if someone very close to me told me this same story i would feel confused and helpless about what to say or how to get them help it was just one of those secrets that

some are born notorious others have notoriety thrust upon them few realize that their morning mouthwash bears the name of a life saving british baron or that their sugary graham crackers would be abhorred by the health food fanatic who concocted the flavorless original recipe throughout history the proper names of figures both noble and notorious have slipped into the common and uncommon corners of our vocabulary tawdry

knickers and other unfortunate ways to be remembered details the lamentable lives and legacies of history s most infamous namesakes and the words they inspired henry shrapnel died of natural causes despite having invented the shells whose shattering fragments would rain hellfire on soldiers from the battle of waterloo through the vietnam war poor virgin st audrey suffered from a bulging neck tumor and the unwanted advances of an unsympathetic husband but never lived to hear crass vendors eventually hawk her tawdry lace if new york blueblood harmen knickerbocker isn't rolling over in his grave his nineteenth century drawers are at least in a twist over having his venerable family name associated with underwear barbara handler has never been happy about providing the name for the original barbie to say nothing of her doll s plastic relationship with ken named for her real life brother in contrast to these dynamite inventor alfred nobel avoided the inevitable merchant of death epitaph awaiting him by using his enormous explosives fortune to establish the nobel prize foundation want to know where your words come from the surprising humorous and often ironic stories behind ninety notable eponyms will take you on an undercover tour of the etymological sausage factory

sportswriter jerome holtzman has been around the game of baseball for more than 60 years during that span he has met and worked alongside most of the greatest writers american sports has ever known in his sixth book entitled jerome holtzman on baseball he tells colorfully in depth stories about the life and times of such legendary scribes as grantland rice red smith jimmy canon shirley povich and many others enveloped inside these personality sketches are heretofore hidden tales about baseball s greatest players

new york city has long been a generative nexus for the transnational latin music scene currently there is no other place in the americas where such large numbers of people from throughout the caribbean come together to make music in this book benjamin lapidus seeks to recognize all of those musicians under one mighty musical sound especially those who have historically gone unnoticed based on archival research oral histories interviews and musicological analysis lapidus examines how interethnic collaboration among musicians

composers dancers instrument builders and music teachers in new york city set a standard for the study creation performance and innovation of latin music musicians specializing in spanish caribbean music in new york cultivated a sound that was grounded in tradition including classical jazz and spanish caribbean folkloric music for the first time lapidus studies this sound in detail and in its context he offers a fresh understanding of how musicians made and formally transmitted spanish caribbean popular music in new york city from 1940 to 1990 without diminishing the historical facts of segregation and racism the musicians experienced lapidus treats music as a unifying force by giving recognition to those musicians who helped bridge the gap between cultural and musical backgrounds he recognizes the impact of entire ethnic groups who helped change music in new york the study of these individual musicians through interviews and musical transcriptions helps to characterize the specific and identifiable new york city latin music aesthetic that has come to be emulated internationally

in a single definitive narrative city of sedition tells the spellbinding story of the huge and hugely conflicted role new york city played in the civil war no city was more of a help to abraham lincoln and the union war effort or more of a hindrance no city raised more men money and materiel for the war and no city raised more hell against it it was a city of patriots war heroes and abolitionists but simultaneously a city of antiwar protest draft resistance and sedition without his new york supporters it s highly unlikely lincoln would have made it to the white house yet because of the city s vital and intimate business ties to the cotton south the majority of new yorkers never voted for him and were openly hostile to him and his politics throughout the war new york city was a nest of antiwar copperheads and a haven for deserters and draft dodgers new yorkers would react to lincoln s wartime policies with the deadliest rioting in american history the city s political leaders would create a bureaucracy solely devoted to helping new yorkers evade service in lincoln s army rampant war profiteering would create an entirely new class of new york millionaires the shoddy aristocracy new york newspapers would be among the most vilely racist and vehemently antiwar in the country some editors would call on their readers to revolt and

commit treason a few new yorkers would answer that call they would assist confederate terrorists in an attempt to burn their own city down and collude with lincoln's assassin here in city of sedition a gallery of fascinating new yorkers comes to life the likes of horace greeley walt whitman julia ward howe boss tweed thomas nast matthew brady and herman melville this book follows the fortunes of these figures and chronicles how many new yorkers seized the opportunities the conflict presented to amass capital create new industries and expand their markets laying the foundation for the city's and the nation's growth winner of the fletcher pratt award for best non fiction book

the anti homosexuality dubbed kill the gays bill of 2009 propelled uganda to the forefront of global media in its initial manifestation the bill threatened to penalize aggravated homosexuality with the death penalty the media attention earned by the proposed legislation opened avenues for transnational cooperation and communication between us based human and lqbti rights organizations and kuchu or lqbti uqandans the economies of queer inclusion focuses on this transnational relationship and the complications that arise when international currency and professionalization transform grassroots organizing this book excavates how transnational advocacy which aims to empower lgbti rights activism actually restructures and in some cases limits local movements with interview and ethnographic data with activists in kampala uganda and new york city the research highlights how the introduction of international attention and funding causes organizations to restructure their movement goals and strategies in order to best attract desired partners the funder funded relationship causes both local discord and transnational divestment from alternative forms of organizing the research presents a compelling counter narrative that exposes that the development of this economy did not occur because of the anti homosexuality but rather inspired the legislation and then peaked in the five years following as an engaged ethnographic look into a social justice movement the text explores organizational structures and activist strategies in order to critique and strengthen future mobilization accordingly the text applies various sociological and critical race theories to provide an incisive and in depth exploration of a powerful political moment

unbeknownst to most of the city s inhabitants a rural community of garbage workers once existed on a now vanished island in new york city barren island was a swampy speck in jamaica bay where a motley group of new immigrants and african americans quietly processed mountains of garbage and dead animals starting in the 1850s they turned the waste into useful industrial products until their eviction by robert moses in the name of progress in 1936 barren islanders built businesses fought fires demanded a public school and worshipped at churches as they created a quintessentially american community from scratch author miriam sicherman tells the story of a brooklyn neighborhood lost in the annals of new york city history

this is a collection of 20 haunting true stories each revealing the struggle for jewish identity and the solace gained through faith as a child esther hautzig and her family were exiled to siberia for being capitalists thus inadvertently escaping the nazis after world war ii hautzig began collecting the true stories of those who lived and died during the horror of the holocaust of jews in vilna in the united states and in israel

compiling a portrait that s both fascinating and deliciously fun gastropolis explores the endlessly evolving relationship between new yorkers and food

when it comes to food there has never been another city quite like new york the big apple a telling nickname is the city of 50 000 eateries of fish wriggling in chinatown baskets huge pastrami sandwiches on rye fizzy egg creams and frosted black and whites it is home to possibly the densest concentration of ethnic and regional food establishments in the world from german and jewish delis to greek diners brazilian steakhouses puerto rican and dominican bodegas halal food carts irish pubs little italy and two koreatowns flushing and manhattan this is the city where if you choose to have thai for dinner you might also choose exactly which region of thailand you wish to dine in savoring gotham weaves the full tapestry of the city s rich gastronomy in nearly 570 accessible informative a to z entries written by nearly 180 of the most notable food experts most of them new yorkers savoring gotham addresses the food people places and institutions that have made new york cuisine

so wildly diverse and immensely appealing reach only a little ways back into the city s ever changing culinary kaleidoscope and discover automats the precursor to fast food restaurants where diners in a hurry dropped nickels into slots to unlock their premade meal of choice or travel to the nineteenth century when oysters cost a few cents and were pulled by the bucketful from the hudson river back then the city was one of the major centers of sugar refining and of brewing too 48 breweries once existed in brooklyn alone accounting for roughly 10 of all the beer brewed in the united states travel further back still and learn of the native americans who arrived in the area 5 000 years before new york was new york and who planted the maize squash and beans that european and other settlers to the new world embraced centuries later savoring gotham covers new york s culinary history but also some of the most recognizable restaurants eateries and culinary personalities today and it delves into more esoteric culinary realities such as urban farming beekeeping the three martini lunch and the power lunch and novels movies and paintings that memorably depict gotham s foodscapes from hot dog stands to haute cuisine each borough is represented a foreword by brooklyn brewery brewmaster garrett oliver and an extensive bibliography round out this sweeping new collection

theodore pratt 1901 1969 was the author of fifteen books that depict the sunshine state earning him the informal title of literary laureate of florida in the mid twentieth century he portrayed the culture of south florida especially in his florida trilogy which includes his most famous book the barefoot mailman 1943 and continues with the flame tree 1948 and the big bubble 1949 he also wrote vividly about the florida keys in mercy island 1941 the everglades in escape to eden 1953 and chief osceola in a novel and a play both called seminole 1953 1954 pratt did research for his books that created an archive that is valuable for researchers today and a collection of stories and essays florida roundabout 1959 that offers a deep insight into the lives of poor whites in the state this biography tells the story of pratt s life and work to florida fans teachers young writers and literary scholars who are interested in southern literature florida literature and mid century american film and literature

catalog of kate vrijmoet's solo show at seattle s center on contemporary art in february 2010 includes paintings from her accident series her non ordinary reality series and numerous drawings the show is introduced by curator joseph c roberts and essays by daniel kany and elatia harris round out this volume

even the most ardent baseball fan will be amazed at the quirks quips and comments in baseball gold consisting entirely of bits and pieces of baseball s offbeat history this volume covers teams and a myriad of players owners managers and broadcasters from their exploits on the field to those behind clubhouse doors it can even be picked up in the middle and read backward one nugget at a time

while floating down on the ice floe in the midst of dirt and darkness hungry and cold i wondered at myself that i could have learned in a few short months to have eaten such things and submitted to such practices as but few civilized persons have ever been called to endure in june of 1871 navigator george e tyson and the polaris sailed forth from new york to pursue an american dream to be the first expedition to explore the icy waters of the north pole led by captain hall veteran arctic explorer and funded with a 50 000 grant from the us congress it seemed the polaris would not fail but the voyage was doomed from the start impassable ice floes a crew that couldn't get along and eventually the poisoning and untimely death of captain hall finally as winter approached tyson and half the crew found themselves stranded on the arctic ice incapable of reconnecting with their ship they would not be rescued for six months through tyson's detailed notes and a journal written upon the ice journey to the arctic tells the harrowing tale of survival slow starvation and of men turned wild in frigid climes this definitive edition includes original engravings of the explorers and their findings charts and maps of their journey and a new introduction by famed adventure essayist and arctic exploration expert peter stark

the brownsville east new york neighborhood of the 1930 s 40 s and 50 s is now but an almost faded memory a time warp as it were today it is a neighborhood that has been eviscerated and exists only as a geographic locale through the collective memories of the famous and the not so famous jerry chatanow and bernie schwartz have elicited and chronicled a treasure trove of anecdotes and remembrances that bring back to life a once vibrant and exhilarating neighborhood the authors vividly transport the reader back to a bygone era of street games egg creams mello rolls and knishes patriotism at the home front plush movie palaces the dodgers the knicks boxing venues old time radio and the neighborhood settlement houses with its open doors waiting to welcome the teeming masses anyone from small town or big city who was ever enriched by the nurturing warmth the loyalties and camaraderie of a neighborhood will enjoy this major contribution to the oral history of america this is a story told within the context of this country s transformation from the great depression to world war two to baby boomer prosperity the authors were both observers of and participants in what in retrospect proved to be a triumphant generation
